Paper Rose Instructions

Tip: a combination of glue sticks and liquid school glue seems to work best for this craft.

1. Print the templates.

2. Cut the template apart and staple pieces to colored paper.

- Cut one square base for each flower.
- Cut 3 "clover" shapes for each flower.
- Cut 8 large petals for each flower - remember to cut the slit in the bottom of petals.
- Cut 6 small petals for each flower - remember to cut the slit in the bottom of petals.

3. Start by creating the center bud with the "clover" pieces.

- Fold each petal where the dotted line is on the template.
- Fold up two opposite petals and tape one side together. (figure 1)
- Tape other side together to make a small circle. (figure 2)
- Pull up remaining two petals and loosely tape them to the center circle.

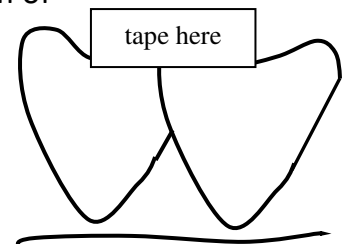

4. Finish center bud.

- Place the first taped bud into center of second clover.
- Pull up petals individually and loosely tape them to center bud.
- Repeat for third clover.

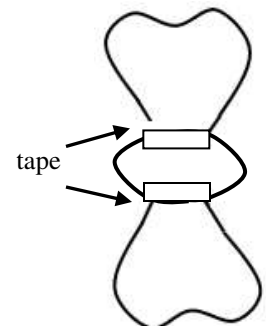

5. Glue large and small petals to make a 3-D shape.

- Using a glue stick, put glue on the paper to the left of the cut on the bottom of the petal.
- Lift up right side of cut and slide it to the left to push down on the left side over the glue. This should make your petal stand up right. (figure 3)
- Repeat for ALL large and small petals.

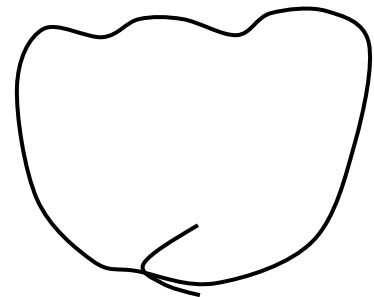

6. Use liquid school glue to glue the bottom of four large petals to the square base. One petal on each side.

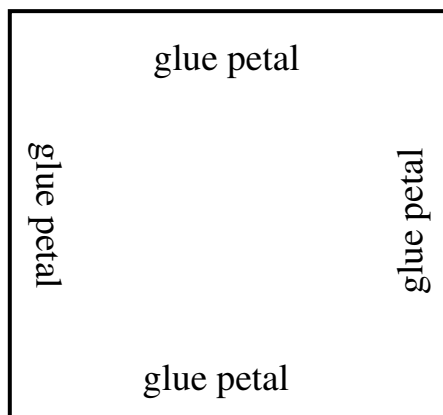
7. Glue four more large petals inside the first set of petals.

- Do not glue petals in the exact same places, but across and between for balance.

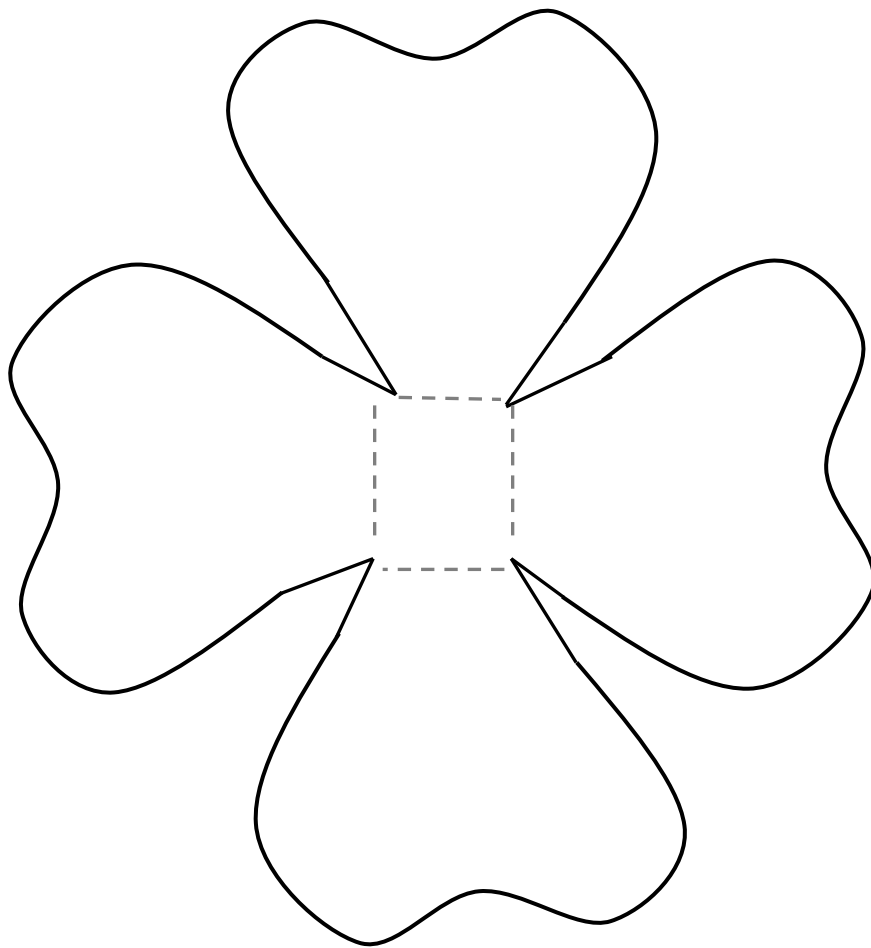
8. Glue three small petals inside large petals, glue next three small petals inside.

9. Glue bud to center of flower.

Print and staple to multiple sheets of red or pink paper. Then cut.



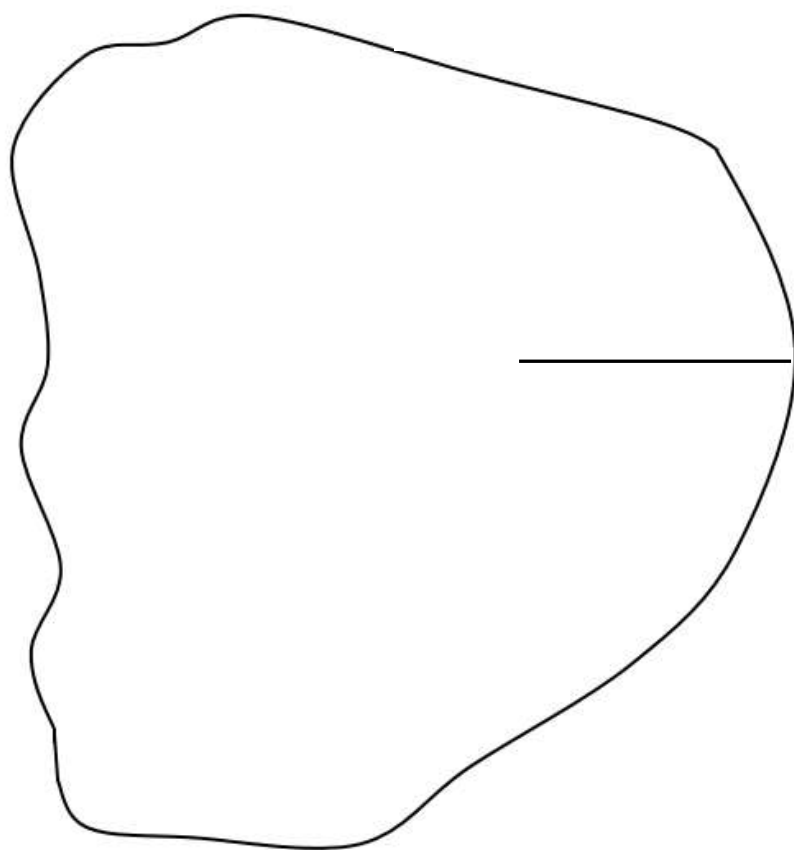
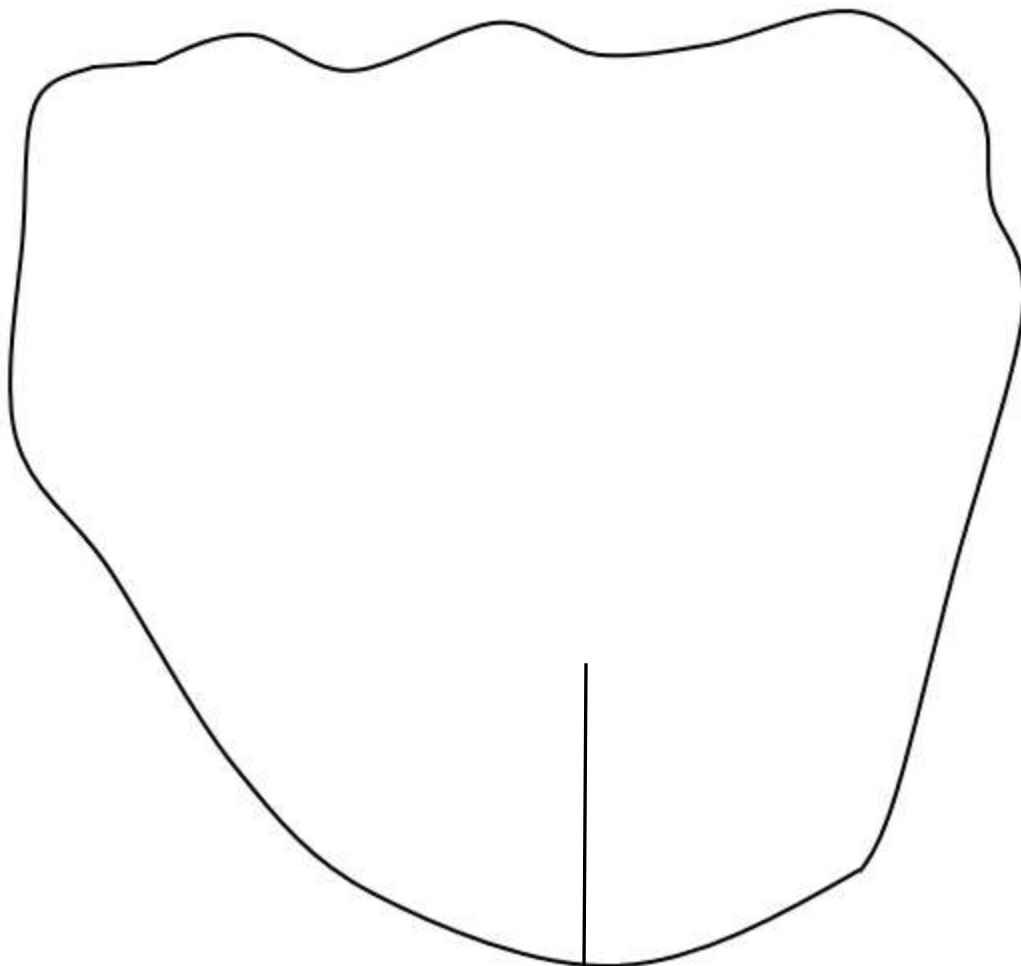
Cut out one square
