



Halloween Party Pack



Thank you for choosing a Crafting Jeannie Activity Pack! Let's get started making your next event super easy and super fun!

This party pack works hand-in-hand with my article, **How to Throw an Epic Classroom Halloween Party**, <https://www.craftingjeannie.com/epic-classroom-halloween-party/>

Start by printing out as many copies as you need for your event. You can use the print-out activities like a coloring page and a word search to keep children busy while you set up crafts and games. If you have enough help, you may want to have stations at your event. You can set-up different areas for each activity and the children can rotate. You can even assign an activity from this packet to each volunteer and spread out the responsibilities.

If you're hosting your event by yourself, Do Not Fear - everything in the packet can be done with a group of kids lead by one adult. The crafts are easy to prepare and simple to make, the bingo game includes 30 unique bingo cards. Kids will love all of the activities and the games will get them moving.

Most of the activities require crayons or markers. The crafts require glue sticks and sometimes a black crayon or marker.

Printing tips: Pages 1-2, Introduction - print once if desired.
Pages 3-8, Activities - print one for each child.
Pages 9-27, Games Ideas & Craft Templates - print once and used to plan the party.
Pages 28-43, Bingo - it has two unique cards per page, print enough for half of the children and cut in half. Don't forget to print page 28 which contains the Bingo Calling Cards

In this activity packet, you will find:

A Word Search (print one for each child)

Kids will enjoy a themed word search, they can find all the words or just find five words, use it however you need it.

I Spy (print one for each child)

Kids can spy and count Halloween items.



Coloring Pages (print one for each child)

Keep kids of any age happy with a coloring page.

A Word Scramble (print one for each child, print one answer key)

Keep kids entertained with a themed word scramble. Use the pictures to help figure out some of the words.

Party Game Ideas (print once)

Use these ideas as rotating game stations or as group activities.

Easy Craft Templates (print once - use to cut out craft shapes)

Staple these templates to colored construction paper and quickly cut out enough supplies for your entire group. Make sure to provide glue sticks and a black marker or crayons. Find more free group crafts at www.CraftingJeannie.com

Bingo - with 30 unique bingo cards

(two unique cards per page, print enough for half of the children, then cut in half)

Play traditional (horizontal, vertical, or diagonal line wins) or if you need a longer game, play to fill entire cards. No need to bring bingo covers, just use a marker or crayon to mark each called box with an "X".








Halloween Party Games



Game 1: Halloween Relay. Divide the players into two teams. Put a bin/basket for each team across the room, you could even use a plastic pumpkin. The children will be in two lines, each child must complete a mini obstacle course from one side of the room to the other. On the way there, they must pick up a Halloween item (from Dollar Store or printout) and place it in the pumpkin, then come back and the next child will go. The first team to get all of their items in the pumpkin wins. You can use items from the Dollar Store like bugs, teeth and eyeballs. OR you can printout an item for each child in each team (you can use the printouts from the bingo calling cards found in this packet - It's ok to have more than one of the same item). Here are a few obstacle course ideas: tape a line on the floor that they must balance on, a hoop they must pick up and put over their head and down to their feet before they keep going, the adult leader can hold a broom they must crawl under, use bowls from the Dollar store upside-down as "rocks" they must step on, have a toy tunnel or large cardboard box they must crawl through.

Game 2: Eyeball Cup toss. Make a square or triangle with cups. Write scores inside each cup rim. Give 3 eyeballs (from the Dollar Store) to each player and they must stand back and toss plastic eyeballs into the cups. The player with the highest score wins.



Game 3: What's in the Ghost Poop? This is one of my favorite games, but it's MESSY! Make sure you have paper towels and a way to clean up afterwards. Also, use a disposable table cloth under the game space. Divide your group into two teams and have two buckets or have a bucket for each child in your group. I get orange and green buckets from the Dollar Store. Fill the buckets half-way with shaving cream (Dollar Store). Then hide Halloween items in the shaving cream - bats, spiders, eyeballs, plastic skeletons, worms, etc. Here's the important part, **you must have exactly the same items in each bucket**. Then to play the game, have the kids roll up their sleeves. Tell them, "everyone find a worm". The first one to find the worm wins that round. Play as many rounds as you want, the kids just love digging in the ghost poop to find stuff.

Game 4: Don't Get Stuck With The Spider. This game is a Halloween version of hot potato. Use a plastic spider or any Halloween item (lots of choices at the Dollar Store). You will need the ability to play music (a radio or your phone). Have the children sit/stand in a circle. When the music starts have them pass the spider. When the music stops, the person holding the spider is out. Play until there is one player remaining. If you are in charge of the music, turn your back as they play so you are being fair about stopping the music. There are Hot Potato videos on youtube that randomly start and stop music and there are Hot Potato timer apps that you can also use. You can also use Halloween music like "The Monster Mash".

Game 5: Ghost Bowling. Stack six plastic cups in a tower. Use clear cups and draw ghost faces on them. Have the children take turns rolling a ball or pumpkin across the table or floor to try to knock over the cups. You can have two towers if you're playing in teams. Have the kids take multiple turns.

Game 6: Toilet Paper Mummy Game. Separate your group of kids into two teams. Each team gets to pick a child and wrap them in toilet paper from head-to-toe. Give them a short time limit. At the end of the time limit have the two mummies race from one side of the room to the other. Repeat until all children get a turn being the mummy.

Game 7: Poke a Pumpkin Game. You will need as many cups as there are children in the class, orange tissue paper, and a glue stick or rubber bands. Put some small prize in each cup or a piece of paper with a fun activity (for example, "run around in a circle"). Cut a tissue paper square larger than the opening up the cup. Either use the glue stick around the rim of the cup to glue the tissue paper to the top of the cup or use a rubber band to hold the tissue paper in place. Once all of the cups are full, use a hot glue gun or superglue to arrange the cups in the shape of a pumpkin on a poster board. Each child will have one turn to poke through the tissue paper for the game. Here are some more ideas for activities: "Do 10 jumping jacks", "Run in place for 5 seconds", "Sing the alphabet", "Hop like a frog while saying ribbit", "Make your friend do something again", "Dab", "Act like a chicken", "Yell out your favorite candy", "Say your favorite color", "Pretend you're playing a sport", "Give yourself a high-five".

Game 8: Making Slime Station. This isn't technically a game, but it's also not a craft. Let's face it, kids just love to make slime and Halloween is the perfect time for it! Just pick a slime recipe that is the least messy, and have a way for them to take it home with them. You can have them make small batches of it and put them in containers from the Dollar store or just sandwich bags. In addition, you can add glitter or Halloween confetti. Make sure they know not to play with the slime on the bus ride home. Here's a great glow in the dark [slime recipe](#) from Elmer's Glue.

Game 9: Mystery Hat. Fill a witch's hat (or just a bag) with mystery items and have the kids take turn putting their hands in the hat. They have to pick one thing and guess what it is. Fill the hat with things from the Dollar Store - spider, bat, rat, eyeball, worms, skeleton and more.

Game 10: Push the Pumpkin. On their hands and knees have the child roll a plastic pumpkin across the floor with their nose to one side of the room, then pick up the pumpkin and put it between their legs, they must hold it between their legs as they waddle back to the other side of the room. The child to get there first wins! You can make this a relay race with two teams or time each child and the child with the lowest time is the winner.

Game 11: Costume Change. Put some silly costumes items and dress-up clothes like feather boas, Halloween masks, hats, etc. (found at the Dollar Store) into a box. The child will have to put on 5 (or choose a different number) things to complete their costume. Once finish dressing up, been approved, and undress, they are finished. You can make this a relay race with two teams or time each child and the child with the lowest time is the winner.

Game 12: Tarantula Toss. You will need the white stretchy spider webs and plastic spiders (found at the Dollar store) for this game. Spread the spider web across a space like between two chairs, a doorway, or a corner of the room. Have each player stand behind a line (tape on the floor) and toss small plastic spiders at the web until they get three spiders stuck in the web. You can make this a relay race with two teams or time each child and the child with the lowest time is the winner.

Game 13: Glow Necklace Toss. Set one or two pumpkins (you can also use witch's hats) a short distance away. Give each child three glow necklaces. Have each player stand behind a line (tape on the floor) and toss the necklaces until they get one onto the pumpkin. You can make this a relay race with two teams or time each child and the child with the lowest time is the winner.

Game 14: Pin the Wart on the Witch. This is just like pin the tail on the donkey. Print a picture of a witch's face (easy to find online). Get some sticky tack/poster tack for the warts (Dollar Store). Simply blindfold each child, give them a ball of sticky tack and see who sticks the wart on the witch's nose.

Game 15: Cup Stack. Kids LOVE stacking cups to see how high they can build a tower. I always bring about 100 plastic cups (recyclable) to any party. Challenge the players to see who can build the tallest, and then ask who can build the fastest. If needed, this simple game can usually be unsupervised in the corner of a room.


Print and staple to black paper. Then cut.




Print and staple to

Then cut.




Small coffin -




Candy Corn Craft

Then cut.




